Here are authoritative answers by the Veterans Administration to questions from former servicemen and their families:

Q-Do wives and children of veterans have any eligibility for VA medical care?

A-Not as such. If the wife is a veteran, she might have her own eligibility of course. You may be thinking of the special restorative training provided certain children under VA War Orphans education assistance, but this is training rather than part of the VA medical program. Some children eligible for the War Orphans program but unable to pursue an education because of physical or mental disability may receive training such as speech and voice correction, lip-reading, Braille reading and writing, and the like.
