Film on Christ Available to Churches, Clubs

The inspiring and beautiful motion picture, "The Coming of Christ" will be available again this Christmas season for use by church, civic, educational and social groups. It has been announced by United States Steel Corporation.

Last Christmas season the movie was shown more than 700 times before Southeastern audiences.

The 23-minute, full-color movie, depicting the life of Christ from His birth, through His early years and ministry up to the Sermon on the Mount, was prepared by the famous Project 26 group of the National Broadcasting Company.

The 16-mm. film is composed entirely of views of famous paintings of Christ, as rendered by great artists of the ages. Cameramen traveled all over the world, visiting art galleries and private collections, to capture the paintings on motion picture film.

The "still pictures in motion" technique was used in making the movie, with cameras moving about the paintings to catch intimate detail, then backing away to capture their full glory. This leaves the viewer with the feeling that he has witnessed living action rather than static pictures.

Many famous artists are represented, such as Michelangelo, Rembrandt, Bellini, Bloch and others.

Against this background, Alexander Secorby narrates the story of Christ. In almost its entirety his narration is composed of direct quotation from the Bible. A original musical score, composed by Robert Russell Bennett, adds further to the mood and beauty of presentation.
