

What Questions **Vets Are Asking**

Here are authoritative answers by the Veterans Administration to questions from former service-men and their familits:

Q - Can I borrow money under a GI loan to build a fallout shelter on my property?

A - The Veterans Administration cannot under law loan money for such a purpose, however, it a house you wished to buy with a GI loan had a fallout snelce. that would be taken into conside tion in the assessment of the pro-

Q - How long does it take to obtain a loan on my GI insurance? A - On the average, if the po-licy is "clear" the loan is processed in three days. In one instance, however, in a dire emergency a Texas veteran borrowed \$4,600 to buy cattle feed and it took less than two hours. Be on the safe side and allow three days

Q - I am a 60 percent single, assabled veteran, and my October compensation check was \$152. I know this contained a retroactive special bonus payment. Now what will my regular monthly payment amount to?
