lignently their future careers in this respect. It will enable those found unqualified to get to work promptly on the education, training, or health services which can be of benefit to them.

The President also noted that "... early examination will NOT mean early induction. There will be no change in the present practice of calling older registrants for actual induction into the Armed Forces before younger ones are called."

At the present time, men are being reached for induction between 21½ and 22 years of age, as a national average. In North Carolina the average age of involuntary induction is about 22½ - 23, Mr. William H. McCachren said.

## Duplin Host For Farm Managers

The North Carolina Society of Farm Managers and Rural Appraisers will hold its annual summer meeting and tour on Thursday and Friday of this week.

The group will begin the tour by visiting the Carolina Nitrogen Corporation and Ideal Cement Company near Wilmington Thursday afternoon.

Thursday night they will move to Wallace for a business meeting and banquet at which Mayor Melvin Cording will be guest speaker.

Friday the professional managers and appraisers plan to

visit the Rose Hill Poultry Processing Plant and Ramsey Feed Company, where they can observe hatching egg flocks, broiler flocks, and a feed mill and hatchery operation.

They will move into central and northern Duplin Friday afternoon, where they will visit the O. S. Carroll hog operation near Warsaw, and the Vegetable Research Station, Cates Pickle Company and Faison Vegetable Auction Market at Faison.

Clyde Weathers, extension farm management specialist at N. C. State and secretary of

the society, said the Duplin area was picked for the tour "because of its diversification in agriculture."

Duplin has ranked first in N. C. farm income in several recent years.

E. Hervey Evans Jr., of Laurinburg, is president of the society. W. D. Whisman of Charlotte is vice president.
