The Postal Board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners, Greensboro, N. C., has announced that applications will be accepted until further notice for examination for positions as Substitute Postal Clerk and Substitute City Letter Carrier. The positions to be filled are in the Post Offices in Duplin and other Counties covered by the examination announcement. Starting salaries for positions at first, and second-class post offices is \$2.57 per hour and \$2.19 per hour at third-class offices.

Applicants will be required to take a written test and all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment according to rating achieved, without regard to race, creed, sex, color or national origin.
