

Beulaville Presbyterian Ground Breaking Ceremony

Planning for a new sanctuary is no longer a dream of the Beulaville Presbyterians. With ground breaking ceremonies Sunday August 21, 1966, the new sanctuary will soon be a reality.

Beulaville Presbyterian Church was organized before the turn of the century and was located where Gordon Muldrow now has his office and store.

This organization was not of lasting duration. Reorganized in the early teens the church has steadily grown and expanded its facilities to meet the needs of its members.

The present sanctuary was probably built around 1920, adequate at the time, but now outgrown by the membership.

The proposed structure will be located beside the present sanctuary and will be back from

the street about 50 feet. Upon completion of the new sanctuary, the present wooden structure will be removed, giving the new sanctuary a spacious setting.

Construction is expected to begin immediately on the \$60,000.00 building, which will be connected to the present educational building and will be centrally heated and air conditioned.

Rev. G. Frank Sawyer is currently serving as minister of the church.

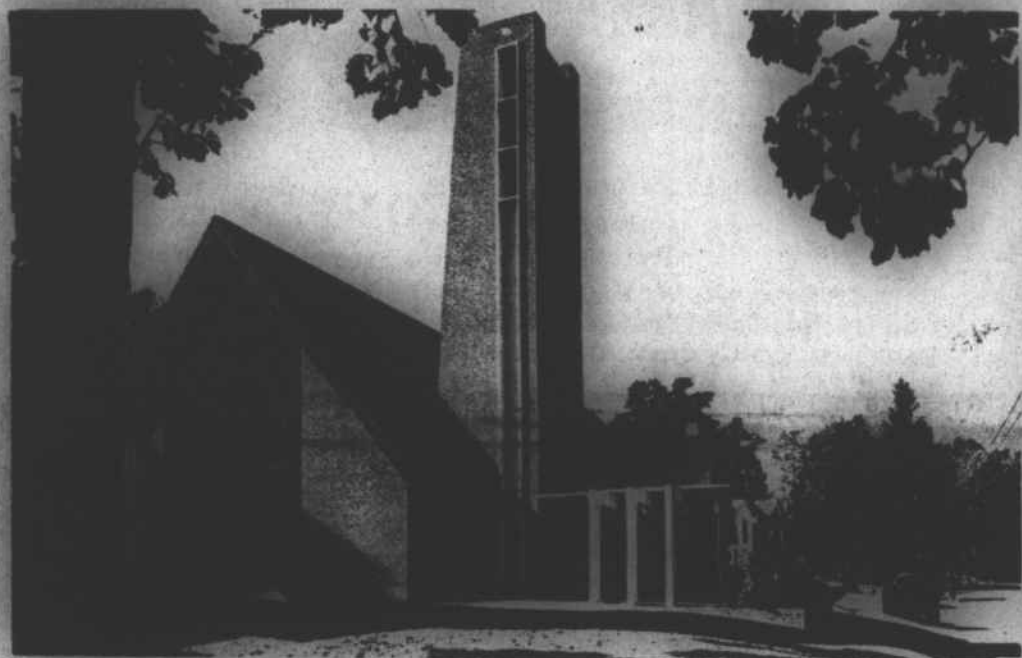
