New Resources For Rural People Provided By EO Act Amendment

An amendment to Title III of the Economic Opportunity Act signed November 8, by

President Johnson will provide additional and much needed resources for hard-pressed, low-income rural people desiring to improve their farm income or start small businesses.

"This important Economic Opportunity Act amendment increases from \$2,500 to \$3,500 the maximum loan that the Farmers Home Administration, of the United States Department of Agriculture, can make to individual farmers or other rural residents at the bottom of the economic ladder," Melvin H. Hearn, State Director of the agency stated. "The amendment also authorizes additional credit to borrowers so long as their total outstanding indebtedness for an economic opportunity loan does not exceed \$3,500.

Mr. Hearn explained that since this Office of Economic Opportunity rural loan program started in January, 1965, the Farmers Home Administration extended credit totaling \$2,142,690 to over 1575 rural people throughout North Carolina.

These Economic Opportunity borrowers are operating more than 150 different kinds of non-agricultural enterprises - in addition to farming - as a result of credit extended through this program. Loans average \$1,380.

"In some cases the cost of obtaining land, buildings and equipment for small rural-based businesses has been a barrier to developing a reasonably sound loan under the previous \$2,500 limit," Mr. Hearn

explained. "The authorization which permits the making of larger loans to borrowers will allow them to acquire and develop more adequate resources to help provide a better standard of living."

This amendment will also make it possible for some rural loan borrowers to expand their operation in cases where needed capital is not available from conventional credit sources.
