purchases well over 50 per cent more meat than 20 years - Each American today gets

an average of 20 pounds more meat per year than his meat dollars would have purchased as

dollars would have purchased as recently as 1950.

Talking purely in terms of dollars, it is admitted that people are spending more for meat now. But since the average family income is higher, the proportion spent for meat is smaller than in earlier years.

The average family of five gets 850 pounds of meat in a year for 4.5 per cent of that family's disposable income.

family's disposable income. Back in 1936, the family of five spent 5.7 per cent of dispo-sable income for 650 pounds of

you wouldn't go wrong by call-ing most current meat prices a bargain. Still, in a nation which claims world leaderwhich claims world leader-ship in many areas of endea-vour, Americans will have to hustle some before they can top the enthusiasm of meat eaters in other parts of the globe, particularly in the red meat department.

Most of the competition is south of the equator. New Zea-landers, for instance, consume an average of 226 pounds of red meat annually. In Australia it's 219 pounds, and 221 pounds in

Uruguay.
