Fourth Grade of Rose Hill School 1944-45

"The Good Old Days"

These demure and poised little folk were the pupils of Miss Mildred Stanley, popular and well-loved teacher of the Rose Hill grammar school in 1944 and 1945. They were in the fourth grade then and are now busy parents, teachers or other career followers. There are several we could not identify and several we could not locate, but the very best information we could get produced the following list:

First Row, Left to Right: Sue Knowles, is now Mrs. Charles Cottle, lives in Rose Hill and is the mother of two very pretty little girls.

Mrs. Bettie Blanchard Hayes; two daughters, Estelle Hayes and Doris Ann Hayes, both of the home; one half-sister, Mrs. Virginia Hayes Lee of Wilmington; one brother, L.L. Hayes Jr. of Latham, N.Y. He was a native of Duplin County and was co-owner and manager of H&H Supply Company here. He was a member of the Rose Hill Baptist Church, the Wallace Chamber of Commerce and the Loyal Order of the Moose.

Second Row: William Thompson who has a home in Rose Hill. He works for the Esso Shipping Company and is out on a ship 80 days and at home for 40 days;

Dalton Hill, next and William's Cousin, lived in Wallace, but disappeared from the streets of the town one afternoon and the mystery of what happened to him has never been solved. Dalton was one of the brightest members of the class, and always made excellent grades; next boy is Ray Lee Benton, works for Tire Sales Co. in Wallace and is the father of 3 little girls. Forest Knowles, the handsome youngster proudly wearing suspenders, gets back to Rose Hill now and then; Lynwood Boone is last on the row and -- where are you, Lynwood?

Third Row: C.J. Williams, who lived near Charity, is now a detective in the Raleigh City Police Force, and a very handsome officer he is, too. Norwood Fussell lives some where in the county, we think, but can't find out just where; Eloise Parker lived near Rose Hill and married a Register. She lives in Wilson; Sonny Scott married Adilade Fussell who joined the class several years later. They live in Savannah where Sonny flies planes as a hobby. He works for Radar Control.

Joyce Johnson is next on the list. She is Mrs. Ward Blanchard, has two children and lives near the Rockfish Country Club. Charles Knowles is married and lives on the farm near Harrells his family moved when they left Rose Hill;

The little Misses with her arms folded is Helen Smith who lived near charity - we don't know where she is now.

Fourth Row: Sarah Starling is married and lives in Fayetteville. She comes visiting at home with her two children now and then; next girl is named Mary Jane Swinson - we did not locate her present address;

Bobby Ann Scott next, lives in Rose Hill, has two daughters and they are all three living in happy anticipation of husband and father Harold Smith returning home from Viet Nam in about another month; Shirley Wilson, next, married Ernest Boatman of Morristown, Tenn. They live in Kinston and Shirley teaches mathematics in the High School there.

Bobby Lee Jones lives in Rose Hill, works for Ramsey Feed Co. and is married to Faye Teachey, the classmate standing just above his right ear! They have two handsome red-haired children;

Martha Dixon married Bill Bynum, Ex-Army Captain. They live in Maysville, N.C. and Martha teaches in White Oak. She has two sons, and visits her parents here often; Elizabeth (Lib) Merritt is Mrs. Ray Hemby of Jacksonville, she is also a career woman. She gets home to visit often; Jimmy Lockerman is an electrician, lives in Rose Hill and would be a good catch for some nice girl!

Fifth Row: Charles Sholar lives near Rose Hill but we were unable to contact him. We don't know who is the sweet looking little girl next, but her last name was Moore. Gene Herring, next, is still around and has never married; Helen Fussell, next, is Mrs. Al Reed of Greensboro; Faye Teachey married Bobby Lee Jones and lives in Rose Hill; Betty Jean Lockerman is married and lives at Penderlea. Her name is Mrs. W.R. Lefler and she has two little girls. The next two could not be identified through the three members of the class who helped with this group all said both "looked familiar". Last on the group is J.D. Knowles who lives in Rose Hill. He is the father of two daughters--one of whom was born last week; so Shels "brand new".

This group became noted in High School for its out-standing basketball team composed of girls in the class. On this team were Betty Jean Lockerman, Faye Teachey, Bobby Ann Scott and Shirley Wilson, all of whom began school together and were graduated together. Later in the 6th grade, Elizabeth (Lib) Waters became a member of the class and both she and her sister Billie Mae Waters, were valuable additions to the team which won several tournaments and were considered one of the best teams Rose Hill ever had.

Note: Last Weeks "Mystery Kids" with their goat were Norwood, Wilbur and Graham Fussell, "Big Sister" was Estelle Fussell. All of them still live in Rose Hill.
