This coming November, 4 years ago, I was elected to serve as your County Commissioner from District III. During this time, I have worked hard to represent you in a manner that you deserve as a tax paying citizen.

- 4 years ago this county had received \$160,000 in CETA money (Comprehensive Employment and Training Act) - this year Duplin County has already received almost \$1,000,000.
- 4 years ago Duplin County was receiving no money in Special grants from the State or Federal Government. - Four years ago the Limestone - Muddy Creek Watershed Project lay almost dormant. Today, it is very much alive with the final public-meeting tentatively set for sometime in June and later application for funding this Congressional year.
- I have worked closely with our State and Federal Representative to achieve mutual goals and accomplishments for Duplin County in the areas of a) Law Enforcement, b) Fire and Rescue Service, c) Hospital, d) Mental Health, e) County Department of Health, f) Social Service and our Duplin County Schools and Technical Institute.
- Re-evaluation of property in all the Counties of North Carolina is mandated by state law and occur every eight years. This of course is the year Duplin County is being re-valued. North Carolina State law says that all property will be valued at 100 percent. The Duplin County Commissioners will be higher or more taxes and certainly not 1.

During the next four years many decisions will be made that will be very crucial to your future and Duplin County. I know that the experience I have had on the Board of Commissioners will be valuable in making these decisions.

These are a few of the things that I have worked hard for - for you the people of Duplin County. During the past four years I have voted for what was morally and ethically right - knowing full well at times that it was not politically popular. I promise you that the next four years I will always vote using that same guide.

I stand on my record of supporting a progressive Duplin County dedicated to providing the services needed for its citizens while at the same time keeping our taxes as low as possible.

I look to the future with the people of Duplin County, with courage and commitment to help bring about these things that will provide for its citizens that they so richly deserve.
