Warsaw Yearly Police Report

Warsaw Police Chief R.P. Wood reported his department for 1982 received 2,210 calls and investigated 179 cases, including 63 larcenies, 28 break-ins, 13 vandalism, 4 attempted breaking and enterings, as well as six shopliftings. Officers made 226 arrests, 273 traffic citations. The violation with the most citations was driving

under the influence with 72 charges. The patrolling officers issued 80 warning tickets and investigated 103 auto accidents, in which 19 were injured and the property damages amounted to \$76,420.

Duplin Business/Industry/Agriculture To Be Surveyed

The vocational education programs in Duplin County schools are conducting a survey of local employers to determine whether the vocational programs are adequately serving the area.

According to Robert C. Tart Jr., director of the vocational education in local schools, "We are trying to collect information which will enable us to decide whether new vocational programs are needed or if we need to revise existing programs to better meet the needs of students and the community."
