Festival meeting at the Pink Hill Town Hall Thursday night at 7 p.m. All interested persons are urged to attend this most important meeting April 28th.

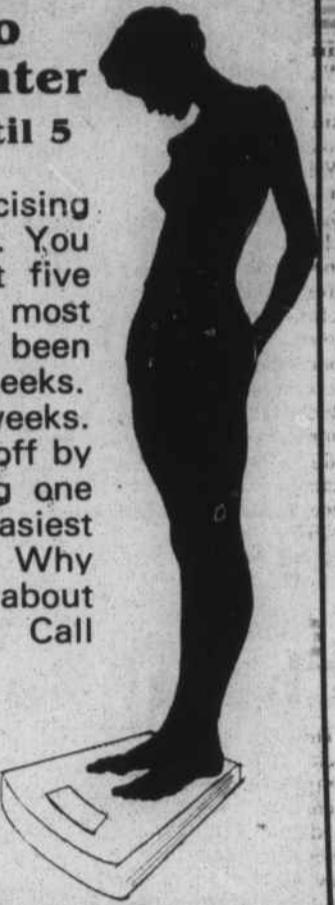
