**A Winning Team:**  
Rice And Strawberry

**RICE 'N STRAWBERRY PUDDING**

- 2 pints fresh strawberries, washed and stemmed
- 1 cup sugar
- 3/4 cup uncooked rice
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 quart milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 tablespoons rum or 1 teaspoon rum extract, optional
- 1 cup heavy cream, whipped

Slice strawberries, reserving 8 for garnish. Sprinkle sliced strawberries with 1/4 cup sugar and juice from lime. Set aside. In heavy saucepan, with tight-fitting lid, bring rice, salt, milk, and remaining sugar to a boil. Stir once or twice, reduce heat, cover, and simmer 25 to 30 minutes, stirring occasionally, until rice is tender and milk is almost absorbed. Add vanilla and rum. Cool to room temperature. Fold in sliced strawberries and whipped cream, reserving 1/2 cup for garnish. Spoon pudding into serving dishes. Top each with a dollop of whipped cream and a strawberry. Makes 8 servings.

Note: Rice pudding served at room temperature is creamier than chilled rice pudding.
