

# We Care Group Started In Duplin County

Grieving parents need not suffer the loss of a child alone, said Arlene Cassidy of Bowdens, who has recently experienced the death of

premature twins. We Care, a group for grieving parents, is being started in the Duplin and Sampson area.

"More often women feel a need to talk about the loss of a child than do men," Arlene

Cassidy said. "We Care will be available to grieving parents at no charge and there is no obligation; the group is being organized for those who feel they have a need to talk." We Care has met one time, an April meeting. Working with Cassidy from the Duplin-Sampson Mental Health Association is Katherine Collins, who meets with the parents to guide the group discussion. Cassidy pointed out We Care is scheduled to meet each second and fourth Wednesday night of the month at the Duplin-Sampson Mental Health building at the Sampson County office complex on Rowan St. in Clinton. Meetings begin each Wednesday at 8 p.m.

"My loss was terrible and

tragic and for a long time I didn't want to admit it had happened," Cassidy said. "After the loss of a child, it is so easy to get caught-up in death and feel you'll never see a light at the end of the tunnel."

"You feel all alone when your child dies and many times your family will want to stop talking about the death, but a mother often needs to continue talking about it," Cassidy said. After the death of her children at birth, Cassidy sought the help of Surviving Parents, Inc. in Goldsboro. Surviving Parents has been organized four years and Cassidy pointed out the group is one of only four her medical doctor was able to locate. The Goldsboro group and Compassionate Friends and Parents Care of Raleigh were recommended to Cassidy along with a private group charging session fees in the Charlotte area.

"We Care is a very informal group where mem-

bers can talk or just listen," Cassidy said. "But, more important, the group will listen and the members understand what the parent is going through." Surviving Parents has members who have lost children at birth and to age 45 years, Cassidy said. The group was organized by grieving parents

within Wayne County with assistance from the county Mental Health Association. Cassidy has mailed information about We Care to Duplin and Sampson family physicians and obstetricians. She plans to follow up with personal visits to the Duplin and Sampson physicians and then contact area ministers

with information about We Care. "We Care is available to couples or single parents who have lost a child through any reason," Cassidy said. "Regardless of the child's age or reason of death, whether it be accident, sickness, miscarriage, premature or stillborn birth, the
