## Pink Hill Liberty Run

The Pink Hill Liberty Run is scheduled for Saturday, July 2 with registration closing at 8:10 a.m. before the starting time of 8:30 a.m. The run has applied for TAC sanctioning. The races are 10 kilometer (6.2 miles) and there is a One-Mile Fun Run.

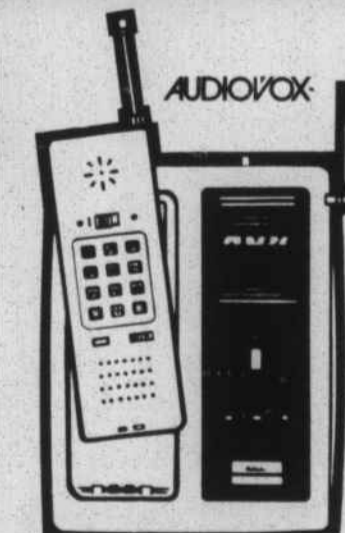

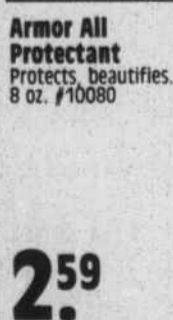
