



## Moser-Miller United In Marriage

On Saturday, the twenty-eighth of May, a candlelight service was held uniting Sonja Yvette Miller of Raleigh and Dr. Wade Hauser Moser, Jr., also of Raleigh in marriage. The Reverend Madison Highfill lead the double-ring ceremony held at the Hallsville Presbyterian Church, Beaulville.

The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert L. Miller of Beaulville. The bridegroom is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Mitchell M. King of Winston-Salem and the late Wade Hauser Moser, Sr. The couple chose a classical wedding service which was begun with a prelude of sacred and classical music presented by Edgar Wells, pianist and Mary Brown, organist. The bride chose from the House of Banchi an exquisitely styled gown of peau de soie covered with English tulle and beaded Lyon lace consisting of seed pearls and sequins which featured a fitted natural waistline covered with a satin belt, long fitted lace sleeves and a chapel-length sweep train. The gown also featured a tulip style high neckline, scalloped peplum and a repeated scalloped border along a 3/4-length tier of lace and again along the bottom of the gown.
