Being family-oriented is a priority with Charlie's Amusements. The personnel are clean and courteous and all the ride attendants sport show caps and shirts during operating hours.

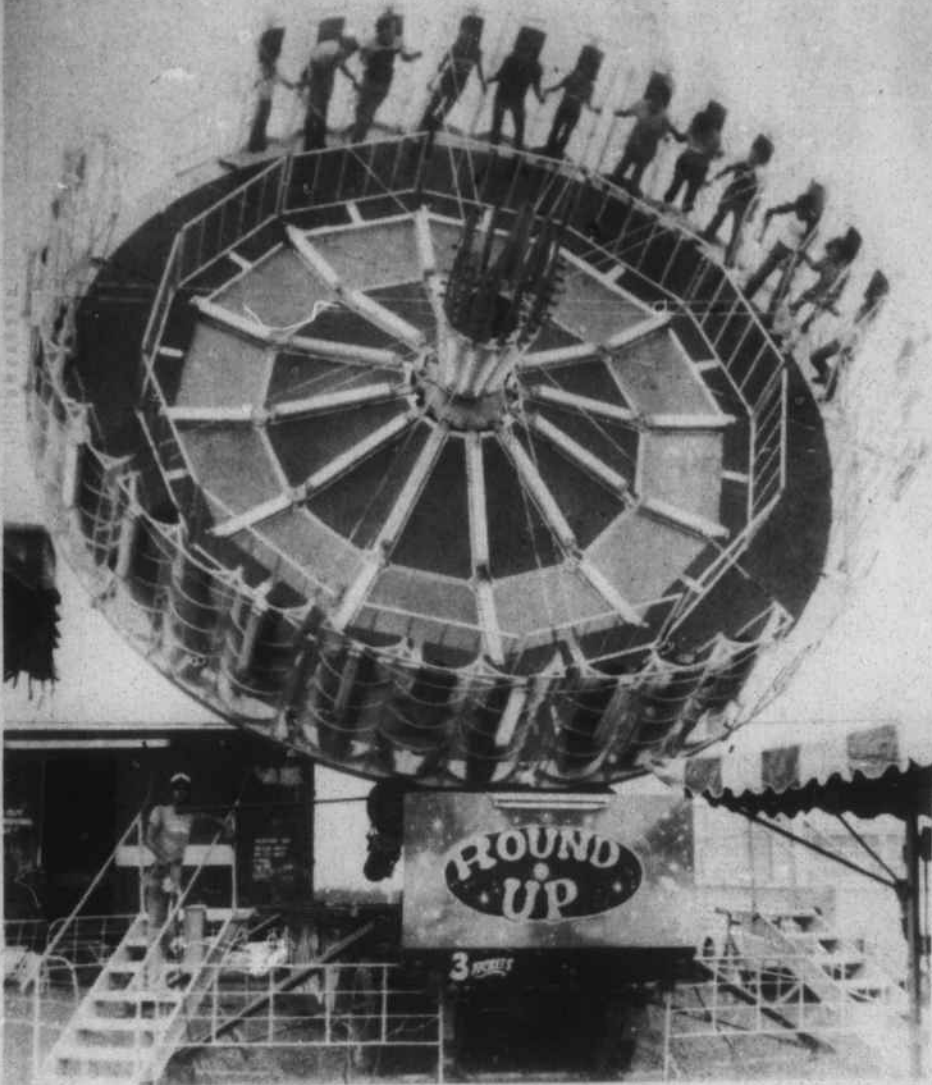
And during these tough economic times, Charlie's Amusements realizes the ex-

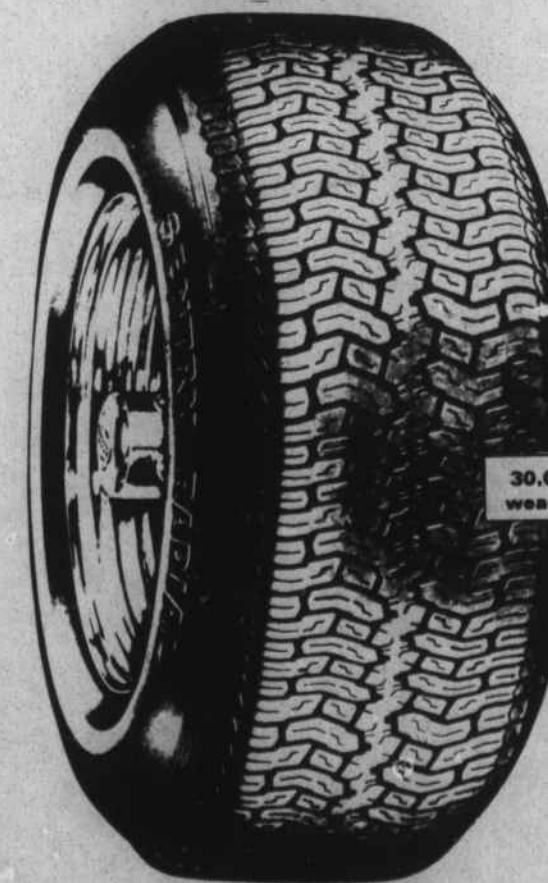
