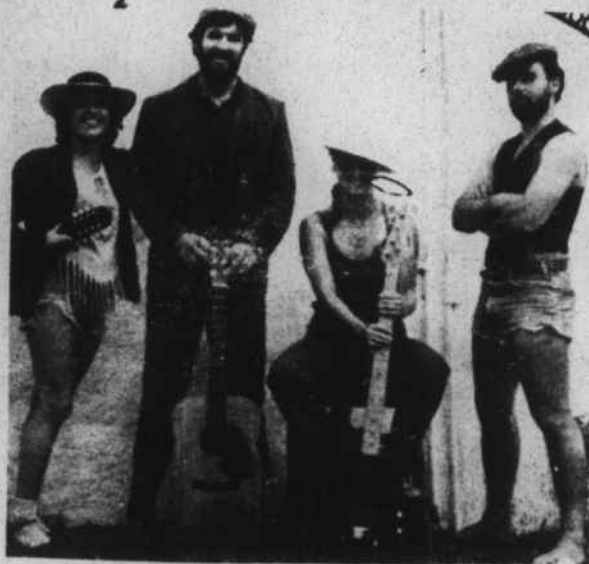

Hot Season Shouldn't Stop Roses

There won't be as many flowers and they may not be quite as pretty, but roses should continue blooming during the hot summer months.

North Carolina State University agricultural extension specialists say that roses can produce blooms if the plants are fertilized,

watered and kept free of insects and diseases.

A good, deep mulch will help the watering situation by conserving moisture.

Feed the plants with a monthly application of a complete fertilizer, such as 8-8-8, to keep new growth and flower buds coming.

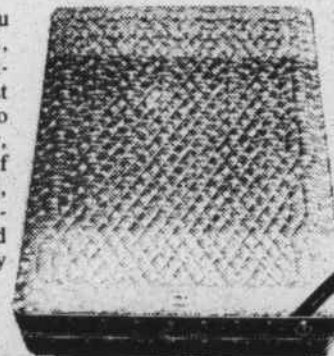
