NOTE: All animals should be entered by September 22, 1983 by contacting Keith J. Hairr or David Byrd, Jr. so space can be arranged.

- Open to any youth ages 9-19.
- An exhibitor may enter one or two individuals weighing between 200-250 lbs.: one for showmanship and one for placing, or one individual for both competitions.
- Entries must be in place by 3 p.m. on October 3, 1983 and may be removed on October 8, 1983 after 1:00 p.m.
- All hogs must go to slaughter after show.
- Exhibitor need not own the swine.

Department Q - Beef (Keith J. Hairr, in charge)
1. Competition in fitting and showmanship.
2. Open to any youth ages 9-19.
3. Heifers should be born between 7-1-82 and 1-15-83.
4. Heifers must be halter broken. For safety reasons, heifers becoming unruly after being entered must be removed by their owners and cannot be entered in the show.
5. Heifers will be placed in one class for judging.
6. Exhibitor need not own heifer.
7. Exhibitors are to provide bedding, feed & tack.
8. Entries must be in place by 3 p.m. on October 3, 1983 and may be removed October 8, 1983 after 1:00 p.m.

4. Animal may be removed October 8, 1983.

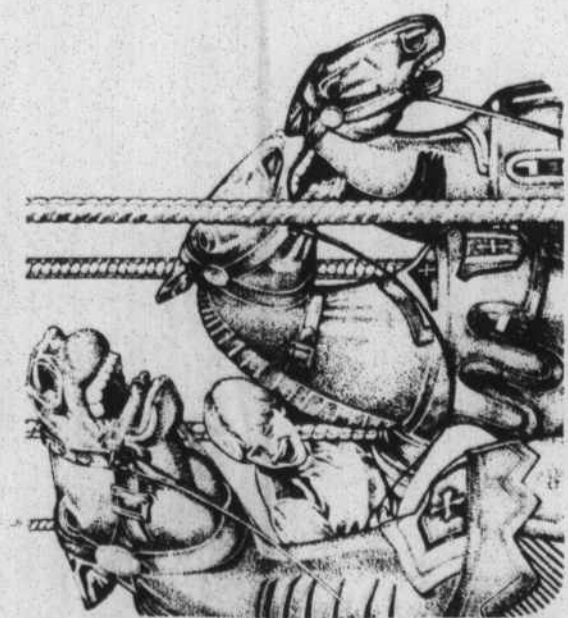
