### "OFF WITH HIS HEAD!"

AMONG THE ANCIENT RULERS WE FIND SOME TYRANTS WHO TOOK THE LAW INTO THEIR OWN HANDS, WHEN DISPLEASED WITH ONE OF THEIR SUBJECTS IT WAS NOT UNUSUAL FOR THEM TO BELLOW, "OFF WITH HIS HEAD!" NO ONE QUESTIONED THEIR AUTHORITY OR COULD DEMAND A COURT TRIAL. IT WAS JUST AN OPEN AND SHUT CASE! ON THE OTHER HAND THE ISRAELITES WERE UNDER MOSAIC LAW WHICH PRESCRIBED CERTAIN PROCEDURES FOR ALL PEOPLE WHO MIGHT BE ACCUSED OF A CRIME. IT FELL TO THE ELDERS, MEN OF MATURE AGE, TO JUDGE THE OFFENDER, CONSIDERING ALL THE EVIDENCE AGAINST HIM AND FINALLY DECIDE HIS INNOCENCE OR GUILT. THE MORALITY OF THE MOSAIC LAW, STRICT AS IT WAS, GAVE EACH ACCUSED THE PERSONAL DIGNITY OF PRESENTING THE FACTS OF HIS CASE. THE PETTY RULERS DESTROYED HUMAN RIGHTS AND DIGNITY, JUDGING ALL CASES ON THE BASIS OF THEIR OWN NARROW VIEWPOINT--USUALLY IN AN AROUSED STATE OF ANGER. THE LAWS WHICH THE ISRAELITES ADHERED TO, ALTHOUGH THEY WERE SEVERE, WERE MORALLY EXACT.
