

Warsaw Youth Killed In Accident

Mark Alexander Huffman, 16, of Warsaw, died early Saturday morning following a traffic accident Friday night.

According to the Warsaw Police Department, the accident occurred near Warsaw Junior High School on N.C. 24.

Huffman was killed when a

car driven by Michael Kent Ezzell, 16, of Warsaw, hit the car he was driving from behind and knocked it into a Union activity bus carrying 27 students, according to a report by Patrolman Steve Stancil.

Ezzell was charged with careless and reckless driving and failure to reduce speed to avoid an accident. None of

the students in the bus were injured, the report said.

Huffman was a junior at James Kenan School. He played in the summer baseball program in Duplin County and Junior Varsity baseball at James Kenan last year. He was in the top fourth of his class academically.

Warsaw Policeman Steve Stancil stated the Huffman auto was traveling toward Clinton when it made a right turn into the driveway at Warsaw Junior High School. The Ezzell vehicle struck the rear of the Huffman vehicle causing the Huffman vehicle to leave the highway and collide with a fire hydrant and a brick wall beyond the driveway. The Ezzell vehicle then pulled into the left lane after colliding with the Huffman vehicle and struck the school bus which was in the left lane of the highway.

FOUR-FOOTED TRANSPORTATION

IN ANCIENT BIBLICAL TIMES, HORSES AND CAMELS WERE A SURE MODE OF TRANSPORTATION. HOWEVER, HORSES WERE USED ONLY IN WARFARE, WHEREVER THE TERRAIN PERMITTED AND CHARIOTS COULD BE MANIPULATED. THE ISRAELITES HAD NO HORSES PER SE, UNTIL THE REIGN OF DAVID. HE ESTABLISHED SOME CAVALRY BUT IT WAS KING SOLOMON WHO IMPORTED THEM FROM EGYPT IN VAST NUMBERS, PAYING ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY SHEKELS OF SILVER FOR EACH ANIMAL. (1 KINGS 10:28) ON THE OTHER HAND THE CAMEL COULD BE USED FOR TRANSPORTATION AND WAS VALUABLE AS A BEAST OF BURDEN, BEING CAPABLE OF CARRYING LOADS OF FOUR HUNDRED POUNDS OR OVER--ALSO THEIR LIFE SPAN WAS LONGER AND THEY WERE A SOURCE OF FOOD BECAUSE OF THEIR MILK. THE ISRAELITES KEPT CERTAIN HERDS OF CAMELS JUST FOR MILKING. GEN. 32:15 MENTIONS THIRTY MILK (MILKING) CAMELS--ALSO THEIR HAIR WAS USED FOR TENT MATERIAL AND HEAVY OUTER GARMENTS. WITH ALL THESE ADVANTAGES ON THE SIDE OF THE CAMEL, SMALL WONDER IT WAS PREFERRED OVER THE HORSE!
