

### Daughters Of The Confederacy Hear About Life In Prison Camps

The James Kenan chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy met in the home of Mrs. F.T. Jones in Goldsboro Oct. 12 with Mrs. Joseph Gorjano as co-hostess. Mrs. Celestial Colwell presided.

Mrs. Cora Holland was in charge of the program entitled "Life in War Prisons." Her research described conditions in Union and Confederate prisons. From the study of five prison camps, conditions were generally the same. Rations were scanty, facilities were unheated re-

sulting in disease and death. Many died in an effort to escape. It is a story of diarrhea and dysentery, of typhoid and typhus, of burning sands and freezing cold in rotten tents. It is a story of despair and deaths of thousands and thousands, many of whom could be saved.

A monument has been erected which has this inscription: "At the call of Patriotism and duty, they encountered the perils of the field, endured the trails of prison, and were faithful, even unto death."

### Lenoir Community College Foundation
