Officials at Lenoir Memorial Hospital announced Friday that 74 employees will be laid off beginning Nov. 23 because of a decline in the number of patients.

L. Daniel Duval Jr., hospital president, said the drop had forced the hospital to

implement other cost-saving measures, including a hiring freeze and consolidation of the third-floor nursing section.

Susan Q. Nobles, director of the community relations, said the hospital had projected for its operating budget a daily patient load of 251 for the current fiscal year.

But through the first two months of the fiscal year, the patient load had averaged 217 to 237 patients per day.

The hospital has 281 beds and employs about 813 full- and part-time workers, she said.

Duval said 39 employees would be laid off Nov. 23 and another 35 would be laid off Nov. 26. The employees will

be paid for all accrued vacation and holiday time and will receive two weeks severance pay.
