NOTICE OF SPECIAL BOND REFERENDUM in the ALBERTSON WATER AND SEWER DISTRICT OF DUPLIN COUNTY in Duplin County, North Carolina

A special bond referendum will be held between 6:30 A.M. and 7:30 P.M. on Tuesday, January 10, 1984, at which time there will be submitted to the qualified voters of the Albertson Water and Sewer District of Duplin County the following questions:

1. Shall the order adopted on November 21, 1983, authorizing not exceeding \$425,000 Water Bonds of the Albertson Water and Sewer District of Duplin County, in Duplin County, North Carolina, for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, to construct a water system for said District including the construction and installation of wells, elevated storage tank, water distribution facilities and appurtenant facilities and the acquisition of necessary land, rights of way and equipment therefore, and authorizing the levy of taxes in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

The question hereinabove set forth contains a statement of the purpose for which the bonds are authorized by the order referred to in such question.

If said bonds are issued, taxes in an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest thereof will be levied upon all taxable property in the Albertson Water and Sewer District of Duplin County.

For said referendum the regular registration books for elections in Duplin County will be used and the registration books, process or records will continue to be open for the acceptance of registration applications and the registration of qualified persons from 8:00 A.M. until 5:00 P.M. on Monday through Friday, inclusive, of each week, at the office of the Duplin County Board of Elections located in Room 104 at the Courthouse, in Kenansville, North Carolina.

Registration applications will also be accepted by and qualified persons may also register with the members of the Duplin County Board of Elections, the register and judges of elections appointed by the Duplin County Board of Elections for the precinct in which said District is located and special registration commissioners appointed by the Duplin County Board of Elections, by special appointment. Information concerning the names and addresses of such members and special registration commissioners may be obtained from the office of said Board of Elections at the office of said Board mentioned above, or by calling said office at (919) 296-1010. In addition, certain persons in the armed forces and their spouses, certain veterans, certain civilians working with the armed forces, and members of the Peace Corps may register by mail at any time prior to said referendum in the manner provided in Article 21 of Chapter 164 of the General Statutes of North Carolina and in person at any time, including the day of said referendum.

Those residents of said District who have not voted in either one of the two most recent successive presidential elections or in any other election conducted in the period between said two elections will not be considered to be registered under Duplin County's permanent registration system. Those residents of said District who are presently registered under Duplin County's permanent registration system and who have not changed residence from the precinct in which said District is located to another within the County since their registration will be permitted to vote in the special bond referendum.

The last day for new registration of those not now registered under Duplin County's permanent registration system is Monday, December 12, 1983.

The last day on which registered voters who have changed residence may transfer registration is Monday, December 12, 1983, provided that any person who has changed residence to the precinct in which the District is located from another more than 30 days prior to the special bond referendum may obtain a certificate of removal and record a change of address on the date of the referendum and vote in the District of the Duplin County Board of Elections mentioned above or at such other location as specified by the Duplin County Board of Elections.

Any qualified voter of said District who is qualified to vote by absentee ballot in said special bond referendum may apply to the Duplin County Board of Elections for an absentee ballot. Any qualified voter who is qualified to vote by military absentee ballot pursuant to Section 163-245 of the General Statutes of North Carolina may also apply for an absentee ballot as provided by Section 163-147 of the General Statutes of North Carolina.

Persons who are not certain whether they are registered to vote should contact the Duplin County Board of Elections at the office of said Board mentioned above.

The registration books for elections in Duplin County will be open to inspection by any registered voter of the District during the normal business hours of the Duplin County Board of Elections on the days when the office of said Board is open prior to the close of the registration books, and such days are challenge days.

The registrar, judges and other officers of elections appointed by the Duplin County Board of Elections will serve as the election officers for said referendum.

The voting place for said referendum, subject to change as provided by law, is the Community Building located in Albertson, North Carolina.
