You can make your own household cleanser for walls and floors by adding a half cup of borax, half teaspoon dishwashing liquid and a tablespoon of ammonia to two gallons of warm water.



You can remove spilled food and odors from your refrigerator with a sponge and a solution of one tablespoon of a product such as 20 Mule Team Borax and a quart of warm water. Rinse with cold water.

To remove stubborn coffee stains and smells you can fill any non-aluminum coffee-maker with water to full cup capacity, then add a teaspoon of borax for every cup. Let your pot percolate, then let it stand for 20 minutes and rinse thoroughly.
