## Two Firms In Contention For Project In Wallace

Either Dixie General Contractors Inc. of Wallace or T.A. Loving & Co. of Goldsboro is the low bidder for the general contract for wastewater treatment facility improvements in Wallace. When bids were opened last week in Town Hall, Dixie General appeared to have

entered the low bid of \$860,929.30. The next lowest bid appeared to be Loving's at \$863,888. An inspection of the bids, however, showed that the Loving bid appeared to carry a \$3,000 item that could have been excluded. If the itemized tabulation finds a \$3,000 error, Loving would be the low bidder by \$51 at \$860,888. Don Butler of Henry van Oesen and Associates of Wilmington, the town's engineering firm, said the bids will be tabulated and sent to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for approval.
