NCSU Band To Perform In Kenansville

With spring comes the annual tour of the state by the N.C. State University Band. This year's tour brings the band to Kenansville to perform for all in this area.

The concert is free and will start at 3 p.m. in the Kenan Memorial Auditorium on Sunday, Feb. 26. The concert will last about one hour and will yield an exciting mixture of music from Gustav Holst to George Gershwin, and promises to be a very enjoyable Sunday afternoon family outing.

The Symphonic Band, which will perform, is a collection of the 70 best wind and percussion instrumentalists in the NCSU marching band. This year's tour, which takes the band to the eastern North Carolina, will take the band to New Bern for an evening performance on Sunday and to Goldsboro High School for a Monday performance at 10 a.m.
