



The deteriorating railroad depot at Magnolia appears to be doomed.

The Town Board is advertising for bids to move or demolish the century-old brick structure. The building once served most of Duplin County as a depot for the railroads which became the Atlantic Coast Line and later Seabord System. The board hopes to open bids at its

March 13 meeting. Seaborad System sold the depot to

insurance if it used the building. The railroad also retained the right to order the depot moved or de-molished on 90 days' notice.


The town bought a lot about 100 feet away from the railroad right of way with the idea of moving the

building and opening a museum. Moving the building would have cost \$20,000 to \$40,000, according to bids received by the town.

Various efforts to raise the money have been unsuccessful.

In the latest action related to the building, the railroad company has informed the town the building must be moved or demolished.


