



Michelle are as follows: CREAM CHEESE CAKE Crust

Mix: 1 c. graham cracker crumbs, 1/2 tsp. cinnamon, 1 Tbs. sugar, and 2 Tbs. margarine. Pack firmly in bottom of spring form pan. Filling 5 pkgs. 8-oz. cream cheese

3 Tbs. plain flour 2 egg yolks 134 c. sugar 5 eggs 1/4 cup milk

Mix cream cheese in mixer; beat in eggs one at a time. Add sugar, legg yolks, flour and milk. Blend until smooth. Pour over crust. Bake 10 minutes at 475 degrees. Then turn oven to 200. Bake for one hour. Turn off and let cake cool in oven for one hour. Top with sour cream and cherry pie filling.



Combine the first six ingredients mixing well. Shape in small balls and brown in butter over medium heat. Drain. Place in baking dish. Combine cornstarch, vinegar and sugar in saucepan. Cook over low heat stirring until clear. Stir in remaining ingredients. Bake at 300 degrees for
