Graham To Speak At **County Convention**

James A. (Jim) Graham, commissioner of agriculture, will be the keynote speaker at the Duplin County Democratic Convention on Saturday, April 14 at 1 p.m., Bobbie Marshburn, county chairman, an-nounced. The convention will be held at Kenansville Courthouse.

Commissioner Graham began his career as an agriculture teacher in Iridell County and later served as superintendent of Upper Mountain Research Farm, manager of Win-ston-Salem Fair first full-time sec-

retary of the N.C. Hereford Breeders Association, and manager of the Farmers' Market in Raleigh. He served as president of the National Association of Market Managers and the Southern Association of State Departments of Agriculture.

By legislation, Graham is the chairman of the N.C. Board of Agriculture. He serves on numerous boards and committees relating to the duties of commissioner and the N.C. Department of Agriculture.
