

Graham To Speak At County Convention

James A. (Jim) Graham, commissioner of agriculture, will be the keynote speaker at the Duplin County Democratic Convention on Saturday, April 14 at 1 p.m., Bobbie Marshburn, county chairman, announced. The convention will be held at Kenansville Courthouse.

Commissioner Graham began his career as an agriculture teacher in Iredell County and later served as superintendent of Upper Mountain Research Farm, manager of Winston-Salem Fair first full-time secretary of the N.C. Hereford Breeders Association, and manager of the Farmers' Market in Raleigh. He served as president of the National Association of Market Managers and the Southern Association of State Departments of Agriculture.

By legislation, Graham is the chairman of the N.C. Board of Agriculture. He serves on numerous boards and committees relating to the duties of commissioner and the N.C. Department of Agriculture.

The Commissioner of Agriculture is a member of the Council of State, the top decision-making body in the executive branch of state government.

Heading the convention's agenda will be the election of delegates to the district and state conventions and the consideration of the number of resolutions.

"The county convention is an important link in the series of Democratic conventions leading from the precinct up to the national convention," Marshburn noted. "We hope to elect strong representatives for Duplin County at the district and state conventions and to debate key issues facing the county, state and nation."
