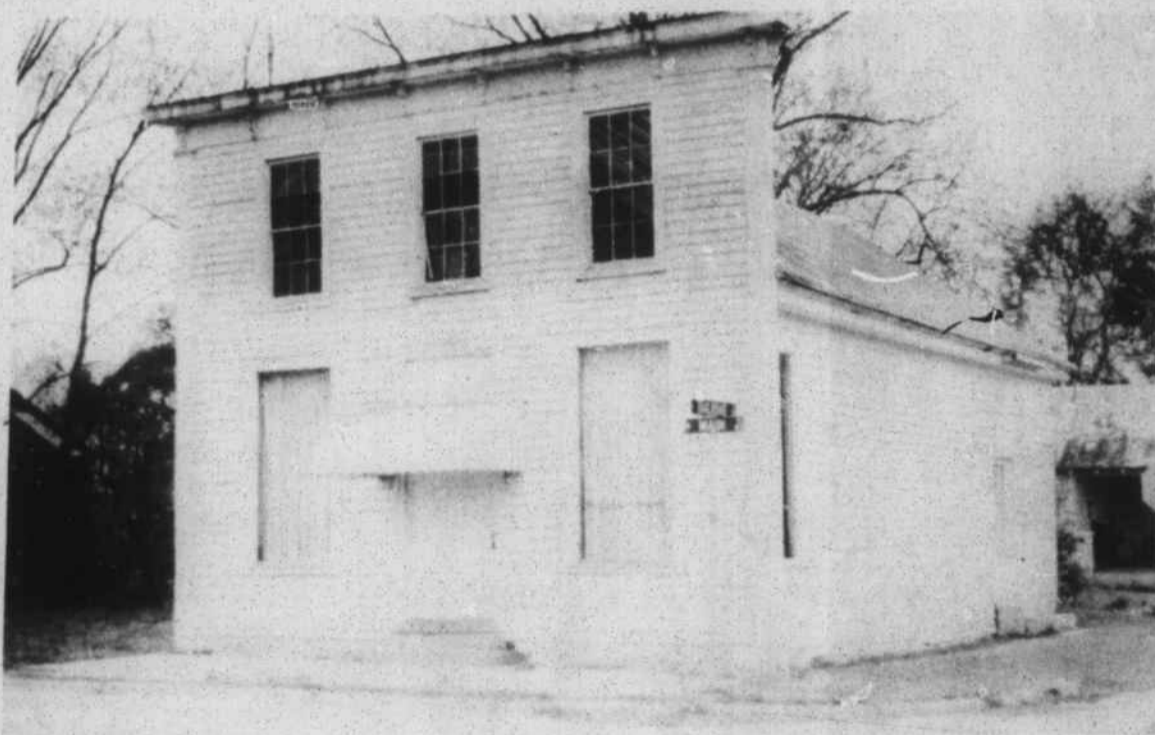




**4-H Fashion Revue**

**Runner Visits Kenansville Elementary**

On March 30, 1984 Mr. Harry Hobbs from Wilmington, N.C. visited Mrs. Connie Mathis' 5th and 6th grade P.E. classes.

Mr. Hobbs was the first person to run up the steepest side of the Grand Canyon. This was a seven mile switch-back run which took him two hours and two minutes to complete. The run was made during August of 1983.

Mr. Hobbs is thirty-three years old. He became more concerned about his physical condition so he began to run every day. He had always wanted to do something no one had ever done before so he made reservations at the Grand Canyon for this run. At that time his wife was a teacher at the Center for Handicapped in Wilmington and he became more interested in their needs.

He raised money by collecting pledges from local people and businesses. He decided to split the money between the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation and the Center for Handicapped in Wilmington.

He trained for about one year by running each day. As part of his training, he averaged running about five miles a day in the sand dunes at the beach to increase his leg muscles. He ordered a special device to regulate the amount of oxygen he received. The reason for this device was because the altitude in the Canyon was much higher than on the coast.

His run was a success and he raised approximately \$2,000.00.

Our students enjoyed his visit very much.
