SAFE ELECTRIC WIRING
 Electricity is Safe When Properly Installed, But is Very Unsafe and Dangerous if Not.
 Electricity is at once the safest and the most unsafe method of illumination — safest when wires, fuses, switches and lights are installed in standard manner; most unsafe when they are not installed in a standard manner. Temporary extensions of wiring in show-window displays and in the many ways that are usual before Christmas should be looked after with the same care that is taken with the permanent work. And not a thing should be done in this respect without the approval of the local authorities. The current should not be switched into new work until it has been approved by an authorized inspector. Because an electric light is not an open flame it should not be presumed that inflammable substances which may be in contact with it will not be ignited.

BAD FLUES DANGEROUS
At Least Twenty-Six Per Cent of Fires Are Caused From Defective Chimneys.
 Statistics show that at least 26 per cent of the fires in this State are caused by defective chimneys and flues. Of course all of these fires could have been prevented and should have been prevented, if the parties building the chimneys and flues had followed our building laws governing these matters, especially in regard to lining these chimneys and flues with fire clay lining. There is no question in my mind as to the advisability of lining chimneys and flues with fire clay lining.
 In our State we are requiring this now in our state building law, and practically all of the trouble is coming from chimneys and flues built prior to the enactment of this law or where it is not fully enforced.—James R. Young, Insurance Commissioner.

The accompanying letter has been addressed to mayors, fire chiefs and fire marshals of Texas by State Fire Marshal English:
Examine Your Flues
 Reports to the State fire marshal from December 10, 1910, to September 10, 1915, show that 3,766 fires, or 15 per cent of the total number that occurred in dwellings, private boarding houses and other like occupancies, were due to unsafe flues. Assuming that the same proportion of fires reported, "cause unknown" is due to unsafe flues, the total number is 4,580, or 20 per cent of all such fires. Unsafe flues cause a larger number of fires than any other one thing to which fires are attributable. The saddest thing about this fact is that all such fires are preventable. They occur by reason of carelessness and indifference that amounts almost to criminal negligence. The season when fire must be had for warmth and comfort is almost here. Have you examined your flues? The rules of ordinary prudence and business sagacity require that everyone make a careful examination of all flues in his property at the beginning of each season, before fire is permitted in them. This precaution is absolutely imperative at the beginning of this season, and more especially so in the Gulf Coast country and that portion of the state passed over by the recent hurricane. The high winds of that storm left in their wake a veritable chaos of unsafe flues, which, if not put in order will cause the fire demon, with hellish glee, to follow the storm and take a fendish delight in completely destroying what the wind only damaged. Again we ask: Have you examined your flues and put them in good order? If you have not do it now. If you do not and fire occurs by reason of your negligence, destroying valuable property of your own and perhaps that of your neighbor's as well, your conscience will rightfully accuse you as responsible for a fire that you could have prevented by heeding this warning to examine your flues.

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION LAWS.
 In New York, New Jersey, Massachusetts, Connecticut, Michigan, Illinois, and Wisconsin the labor employed far outnumbered that of all other States combined, and in each of these States a Workmen's Compensation Law has been enacted.

EXAMINE YOUR POLICY
 The fire insurance business—or at least the method of arriving at the final result, rate—is probably less understood and appreciated by the average citizen than any other business with which he comes in contact, for the reason that, until his loss occurs, he feels that he is paying for something which he does not receive. The man who exercises the greatest caution in the acceptance of any other security—mortgage deed or evidence of debt—will accept insurance contracts without any investigation or security, either as to the worth of the company or form of contract.—Pennsylvania Legislative Report.
