Dr. Little's new building, Princess Theatre will soon be completed.

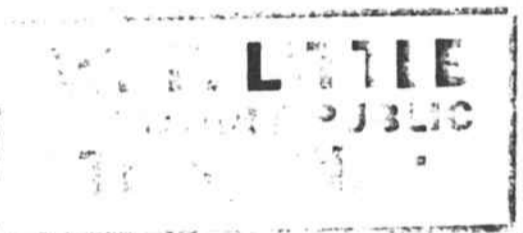

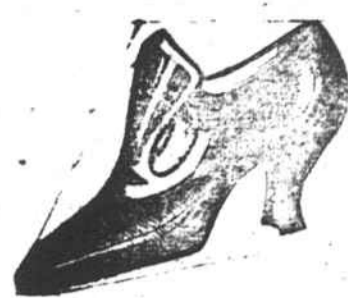

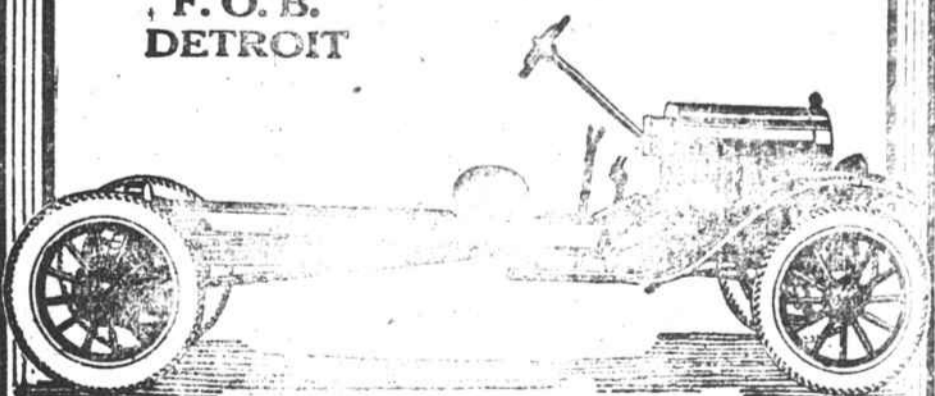
