## JAKL SCHAEFER LEADS CUEISTS

## In Averages He Is Even Superior to His Father.

The leading billiard player in the world at present is Jake Schaefer; that is, billiards as American, Spanish, Japanese, German and French play it. Young Jake was asked whether he is a better player than his famous father was. He shook his head-not in negation, but to signify he didn't know. "Hard to say," he interjected. "I never saw him play a great deal of billiards."

"The answer to that," offered Maurice Daly, who was standing by, "is in the averages. Young Jake has made better ones than his father ever did." Young Jake plays the same fierible, delicate stroke for which his sire was noted, plays the ball just as close and has a touch equally exquisite and light. He plays the same system, yet is more like Frank Ives than his father was, which is to say he studies his shots more carefully. The wisard was more likely to be careless.
