Joseph Birren of Chicago, Ill., not-
ed painter, is in Tryon for a long

ing of some pictures here. Mr. Bir-
ren was born in the city of Chicago,

studied at the Art Institute of Chi-
cago, New York, Philadelphia, Mun-
ich and Paris.

He is the founder of the Art Insti-
tute Alumni Association (1911-1915);
honorary president of the Art Insti-
tute Alumni Association; past presi-
dent of the Palette and Chisel Club;
life member of the Arts Club; Paint-
ers and Sculptors, Chicago Society of
Artists, Laguna Art Association,
North Shore Art Association of Mas-
sachusetts and Connecticut Academy
of Fine Arts.

He is represented in the Chicago
Art Commission collection, Union
League Club, Bermuda Promotional
Commission, the Renaissance, Illinois
Women's Athletic Club, Rockford Art
Club, Joliet High School and other
collections of distinction.

with this picturesque country, and
stated that the climate is excellent
here. He is well acquainted with Er-
nest Barnes, who has just recently
left here for Detroit after having spent
the winter in Tryon. He is a close
friend to Mr. Mazzanovitch, a famous
