

WIDER ROADWAYS

AVERT ACCIDENTS It is estimated by Minnesota high-

way officials that one of the greatest errors in road construction during the past ten years has been building of roads and bridges which are too narrow to properly care for the constantly increasing traffic. Most of the public highways in Minnesota have a right-of-way, which is 4 reds or 66 feet in width, but in many localities this has been found to be inadequate for trunk highway construction, and the state highway department has in several instances previded a right-ofway, having a minimum width of 80 feet. In some cases near congested centers of population, 160 feet has been provided.


The minimum width of roadways. the traveled portion of the highway provided on trunk-route construction, is 30 feet, and the minimum width of pavement being constructed, is 18 feet. On many sections, however, the beavier traveled routes are being graded to provide for a 88-foot roadway which will accommedate a pavement width suitable for four lines of Carolina Golf Tournavehicular traffic, side by side. 
