GOOD ROADS

WIDER ROADWAYS AVERT ACCIDENTS

It is estimated by Minnesota highway officials that one of the greatest errors in road construction during the past ten years has been building of roads and bridges which are too narrow to properly care for the constantly increasing traffic.

The minimum width of roadways, the traveled portion of the highway provided on trunk-route construction, is 30 feet, and the minimum width of pavement being constructed, is 18 feet. On many sections, however, the heavier traveled routes are being graded to provide for a 38-foot roadway which will accommodate a pavement width suitable for four lines of vehicular traffic, side by side.

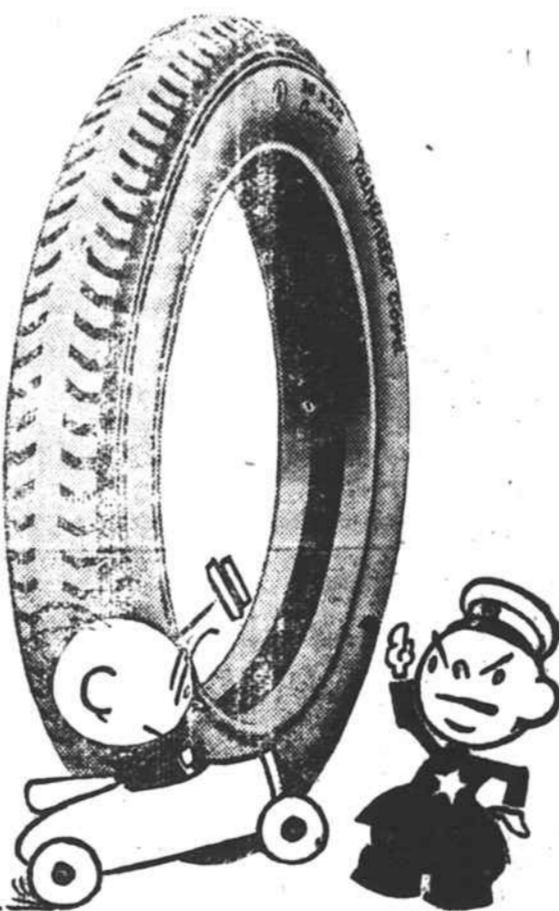
