Voters In U. S.

Nov. 1 Will Total 93,914,000 Persons

WASHINGTON — Some 93,914,000 persons in the United States will be of voting age as of Nov. 1, 1948, according to estimates of the U. S. Census Bureau.

That is 10,000,000 more than were able to vote in the 1940 elections, 4,200,000 more than in 1944. It is also estimated that women will outnumber the men by 1,570,000.

Numerous organizations, including the major political parties, the CIO, the PAC, the Junior Chamber of Commerce and the League of Women Voters, are working on intensive campaigns to get out the vote.

Not only are these outfits interested in getting citizens to the polls in November, but they are working to see that people know what they are voting for.

The National Board of the League of Women Voters, at its biennial convention, April 26-30, at Grand Rapids, Mich., will decide how best it may arouse citizens to help solve the crucial problems of the times.

Canning Should Begin Now, Advises Extension Officer

COLLEGE STATION, Raleigh. — It is not too early for housewives to start rounding up their canning equipment and getting it in order, says Miss Ruth Current, State home demonstration agent for the State College Extension Service.

"It's just as important to conserve food this year as it was any year during the war," Miss Current said. "Canning should be done by a budget and according to the number in the family."

Now is a good time to count jars and buy new ones if necessary, the home agent continued. There will be need for a water bath canner with rack. The gauge on the pressure canner should be checked for accuracy and safety, and jars, caps, and rims should be in readiness when strawberries, cherries, garden peas, and early corn ripen.

The Home Demonstration Division of the N. C. Agricultural Extension Service will be glad to supply a canning bulletin to any one who writes for it, Miss Current stated.
