Don't Throw Slider Early In Season, Cautions Feller In His Baseball Book

AP Newsfeatures Sports Editor NEW YORK—Bob Feller, in his new book "How to Pitch," advises against use of the slider early in the season. Oddly enough, it was the slider pitch that helped Feller set his strike-out record of 348 in 1946.

"I used the slider in many spots where I had used a curve before," writes Feller. "It is usually pitched to the outside corner, away from a right hander, and also is an effective pitch to a left hander when it is started wide and breaks in enough to catch the other corner of the plate.

"Because the slider has a tendency to place strain on elbow muscles, it is not advisable to start throwing it early in training or very often early in the season. The arm should be in a very good condition before it is used extensively.

"When the slider is fully developed, it will break as much as five or six inches. It does not break as widely as a curve, but it can be more effective because of the suddenness of its action."

Some veteran baseballmen disagree with Feller and the slider. Cy Perkins, for one, believes it is the reason for so many sore arms in the big leagues today. "The pitch ought to be ruled out by the managers," says the Philly bullpen coach.
