Beaufort Juniors Take Two More to Stretch Win Streak

Beaufort's entry in the Junior Tidewater League won its seventh and eighth victories in unofficial play by topping Marshallberg, 7-5, Friday and Bettie, 9-8, the following day. The two wins stretched Beaufort's success skein to seven consecutive victories. Johnny Lynch, who had tossed a one-hitter in his previous effort on the mound, started Friday's contest for Beaufort, but left in favor of Otis Jefferson in the third inning with Marshallberg leading, 4-0. Jefferson allowed but one additional safety during the remainder of the game, while the Beaufort offense rallied to keep the victory streak alive. Donnie Gray went the route for Marshallberg and was charged with the loss. Gray gave up nine hits. Jefferson shared batting honors with Billy Downum, each collecting two hits in four times at bat. Jimmie Fodrie pitched seven-hit ball in Saturday's encounter with Bettie to gain credit for that triumph. His opponent on the mound was Harvey Davis, who allowed 12 base knocks. Beaufort had to come from behind to save this one also, for Bettie had an 8-6 advantage when Beaufort came up for its last links in the seventh and final game. Lynch started the rally off with an infield hit and then stole second. Jefferson got a life via an error by the pitcher, and both runners came in to count on a double
