> The steps for converting a tobacco barn into a seed dryer are surprisingly simple. The crops to be dried should be loaded into two bins, each seven feet wide, nine feet long and six feet high. An air pressure chamber, 30 inches wide and six feet high, is built between bins and the outside wall. A fan is mounted in the barn wall to draw air from the barn and


