(Continued From Page One) roll down an incline in several minutes, and then are placed in corrugated cartons.

From there the worker shoves the carton into the packing room on the east side of the plant. The cans are left to cool and then taken to the labeling machine. They roll through the machine with a "zip-zip-zip," coming out at the end wrapped in the Belliere label.

The cans are again placed in a cart and then sealed, ready for the ride to the grocer's shelf.

When the canning season is at its height, the plant will work on two shifts, Mr. Anquillare says, which will mean 24 hours a day for about a month.

mercy of the court.

MacDonald Carraway, charged with the theft of an auto and driving drunk, was sentenced to one year in jail to be assigned to work the roads, with commitment not to issue if he remains sober and on good behavior for five years. He was also ordered to pay a fine of \$150 and costs.

Alvah Hamilton, attorney for Carraway, entered a plea of "guilty" for Carraway to temporary larceny rather than theft of an auto, pointing out that Carraway was drunk and did not want permanent use of the car. Under North Carolina law, theft is a felony while temporary larceny is a misdemeanor.

The case against Guilford D. Tunnell, who was also said to be intoxicated at the time, testified an automobile, was dismissed when Tunnell, who was also said to be intoxicated at the time, testified that he was under the impression he was being taken home.

Wakes Up in Jail
Tunnell said he then blacked out and did not recover consciousness until he woke up in jail the next morning. Tunnell further testified that he has already paid a fine of \$100 for public drunkenness.

Witnesses who vouched for Tunnell's character were the deciding factor in having the case dismissed.

Paris Willis, charged with public drunkenness and described as an old and repeated offender with many recent convictions, was sentenced to three months in jail, suspended if Willis entered a Veteran's Hospital for necessary treatment.

Alex Curtis, charged with the same offense, received a sentence of 30 days in jail.
