SAVE THE SOIL By Roy E. Beck Soil Conservationist Roscoe Garner of Newport says, "The enlarging of Ram's Horn canal has made a difference in this farm. Last year I couldn't put a tractor into the lowland at all and I had to prepare the land very late in the spring for planting. Now that the land is drained, I had it cut early with a tractor and got my crops planted early. Several farmers, cooperating with the Lower Neuse Soil Conservation District are preparing land now for fall pasture seedings. John Goode has disked his pasture land and is ready to spread two tons of lime on each acre. Ivey Eubanks has done the same on over half the land he plans to seed to pasture. Other district cooperators expect to lime and disk their pasture land during the next two weeks so it will be ready to seed between the middle of August and the first week of September. A trial planting of crotalaria spectabilis on K. W. Wright's farm is off to a good start. Mr. Wright says, "If the crotalaria goes good, I plan to seed over 100 acres of it next year to build up my land." Archie Hardesty cut 94 bales of sericea lepedeza hay from about two acres of his meadow last week. This is the second cutting this year. "Army worms like ladino clover." That's what R. P. Gooding told your County Soil Conservationist last week after worms had cleaned the clover from his pasture in just a few days. Charlie Bell, of Harlowe, is sold on the need for having soils tested for all crops after his experience with tobacco this year. Mr. Bell stated "I raised the finest quality tobacco this year my land ever produced by using the extra potash fertilizer recommended by the State soil testing laboratory." Mr. Bell plans to grow tobacco in a two-year tobacco small grain rotation as part of a complete soil conservation farm plan. Transportation co., Manteo; Charles N. X-Ray (Continued From Page One) the county simultaneously and that if everything went as planned, the work could be done in two weeks. Otherwise, it might take up to three weeks. Dr. Smith said also that he would try to have a "follow-up" unit work the county for checks, and that various state agencies would follow up in their respective ways. The state, said Dr. Smith, will provide the film and solution and for interpretation of the X-rays, in addition to its other responsibilities. The local unit will provide necessary posters, stationery, office supplies, telephone service, dark room electric current, and "two well-lighted rooms." Comprising the working force of the local unit will be the health officer, sanitarian, two nurses, and a clerk. Dr. Ennett said he would need another nurse for temporary duty during the survey, and Dr. Smith pointed out that the nurse could receive special training for this work in Raleigh without any charge to the local group. X-rays will cost the county TB association \$10 per 100 taken, so at least \$1,200 will be needed if the goal is set at 12,000 X-rays. A fund-raising campaign later will ask both industry and individuals to contribute a total of \$2,000 to cover costs of the survey. In suggesting a monthly tuberculosis clinic, Dr. Smith told the group that "it was something to think about." Dr. Smith said tuberculosis clinics have been formed in many parts of the state and have worked out favorably and at low cost. The clinic would be open about two hours every month and would be under the direction of some local doctor who has had training in tuberculosis diagnosis and care. If such a clinic ever became a

Waterways (Continued From Page One) addition to Beaufort inlet at 30 feet. The improvements approved by the board of conservation yesterday are as follows: Oregon inlet — channel 12 by 200 feet across bar and connecting channel 12 by 100 feet to deep water in Pamlico Sound, storm spillway below Avon, approximately one-half mile wide to mean high water elevation. Hatteras inlet — connecting channels 6 by 100 feet inside of inlet to deep water in Pamlico Sound and to town of Hatteras; Bogue inlet, channel 12 by 100 feet across bar and connecting channel 12 by 90 feet to inland waterway. In regard to this improvement Colonel Gillette said that it is important to shipping, fishing, and recreation, and although there has been clamor for alterations there (mouth of White Oak river) no legislation on it has been started. Topsail inlet — channel 12 by 100 feet across bar and connecting channel 12 by 90 feet to inland waterway; Lockwoods Folly inlet, channel 12 by 100 feet across bar and connecting channel 12 by 90 feet to inland waterway. Carolina Beach inlet — channel 12 by 100 feet through beach and connecting channel 12 by 90 feet to inland waterway. Exact location to be determined by survey and tidal studies; Masonboro inlet — channel 12 by 100 feet across bar connecting channel via Banks and Motte channels to inland waterway and stabilization of inlet. Little River inlet — channel 12 by 100 feet across bar and connecting channel to inland waterway. In the course of his verbal report, Colonel Gillette mentioned that provision will have to be made soon for a beach for colored people, probably between New River and Bogue inlet which will mean soil conservation practices. Dr. Hunt remained, married Alice Whitehurst, served as town commissioner and later as clerk of the superior court. A granddaughter, Mrs. J. O. Baxter of New Bern has had his very lovely old stone restored. Buried at Night Capt. John T. Sabiston, father of Mrs. Belle Jurney, died at sea. He was brought home at night and buried by lantern light—before the days of embalming. Mr. Hugh Jones was among the small group standing by in the flickering light for the last solemn rites. Mrs. Jurney and her daughter, Mrs. Eva Wilkins of Mt. Olive, have had Captain Sabiston's grave restored as well as that of three of his children and an unidentified adjacent grave.
