barracuda, spade fish, torpedo ray, ray, frigate mackerel, red porgy, spot-tailed pin-fish, sturgeon, moorish idol, sundial flounder, male and female seahorses, tarpon, two trigger fish and three sailfish 30 and 32 inches long.

Dr. Prytherch says that among the various models cast, one was made of the largest menhaden on record, caught by one of Harvey Smith's boats. Now that the work is completed, prematurely to be sure, Dr. Prytherch is preparing a leaflet describing the technique of making molds, and models of food and game fishes. Contained in the leaflet will be diagrams and information on the making of fish models, based mainly on the work accomplished in the Pivers Island project.

by L. L. and C. D. Hodges of Beaufort. It is the only company licensed by the State to handle oysters which has failed to plant part of its shells, Rhodes said.

The request for the injunction set out that "other licensees are threatening to refuse to comply unless defendants are required to comply, and such concerted action on the part of the oyster dealers would irreparably damage to the natural resources of the State and would virtually destroy the oyster industry in the State." Rhodes attended the oyster hearing Aug. 27 and said that the oyster dealers present spoke heartily in favor of the rehabilitation act of which many had disapproved a year before.

(Continued From Page One) pump attached to the top of about a 10 foot pipe sunk into a deep hole.

"That's where they got their water," he explained. By "they" he meant the still operators. I looked down into the dark hole and at the bottom saw some brackish water.

At the spout where the whisky ran out of the copper coil was a forked stick with a white cloth tied and knotted around the forked part. This was the strainer. I was told that at one still they found an old felt hat that was used as the strainer.

The booming and banging and knocking went on in that little cleared spot in the woods for about half an hour. Limbs overhead shut out the sky and the gnats continued to swarm over the spilled mash which was still giving off a little sizzling sound like ginger ale when it's first poured.

The still was found by the officers shortly after 11 o'clock Saturday night but they waited until daybreak to demolish it. The rig was located about three-fourths of a mile northeast of Mr. Saffrit's sawmill on the property purchased by the American Legion for a fairground.

In addition to bags of cornmeal found on the ground, the operator's overalls and red handkerchief were right nearby, all ready for
