Dedication of Chapel to Follow Revival



Recently completed chapel of the First Christian Church of Morehead City to be dedicated on Saturday afternoon, October 30 following a week of evangelistic services.

Under the leadership of Rev. Charles W. Riggs, state evangelist of the Christian church society, the church in Morehead City will conduct special evangelistic services in its new chapel starting Sunday and closing the following Saturday with a special dedication service of the chapel. Services of the week will start each evening at 7:30.

As a result of the week's revival, an increase of membership of the church is hoped for. Such new members taken into the church at the close of the meetings will be listed, with the present 19 members, as charter members of the First Christian Church of Morehead City.

Present at the closing meeting and dedication on Saturday will be a large delegation from the Christian churches comprising the Pamlico Union made up of the 35 churches of Craven, Pamlico and Carteret counties. Report will be given of the work of the Union and its various departments during the Saturday session.

Previous to the construction of the church building in Morehead City, the Rev. W. C. Foster, of New Bern, conducted services in members' homes on the second Sunday of each month.

With increased interest in the small group Rev. Mr. Foster ministered to the state organization after a survey of the field gave its approval for the building of a chapel.
