High scorer for Atlantic was John C. Hamilton, 15 points. Rose scored 12, and Smith five.

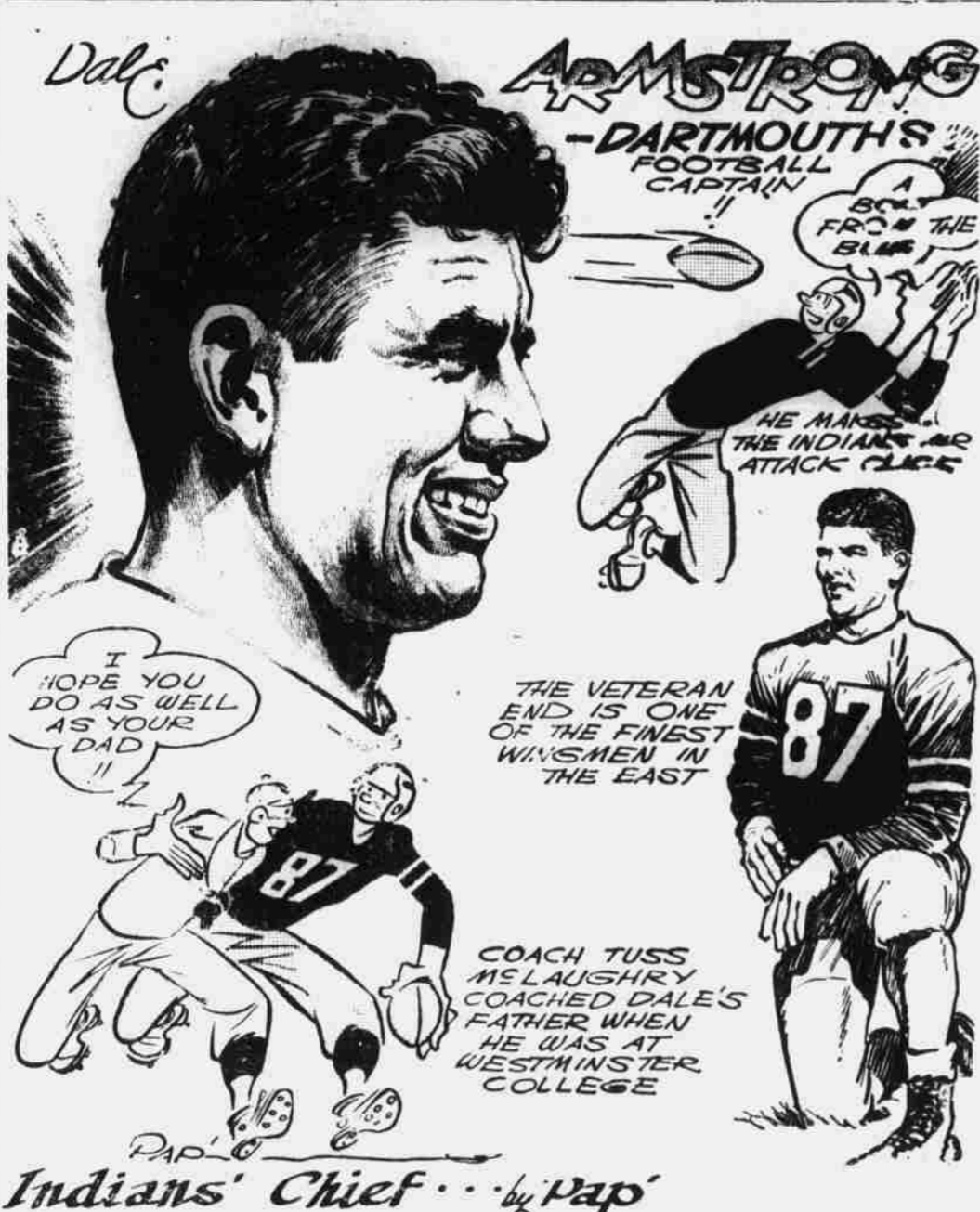
The local quintet led the opposition all the way, with the margin never less than five points. The score was 18-13 at the half.
