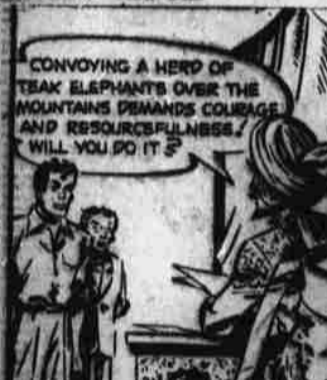

Greece Receives More Than Million Tons of Supplies

ATHENS — (AP) More than one million long tons of foodstuffs, agricultural supplies and military equipment were brought into Greece under American aid programs between Aug. 1947, and Aug. 1948. The Economic Cooperation Administration (ECA) mission here announced a total of 1,306,824 long tons of supplies had been imported since the American Mission for aid to Greece (AMAG) shipment arrived Aug. 21, 1947. Commodities included 459,832 long tons of foodstuffs; 65,799 tons of coal; 39,032 tons of agricultural supplies and equipment; 24,885 tons of iron and steel; 2,755 tons of medical and sanitation supplies and 95 tons of miscellaneous commodities.
