## Polk County 4-H Club To Raise Quail This Year

COLLEGE STATION, Raleigh—Six Polk County 4-H club members will raise quail as projects during the coming year, according to

Paul E. Culberson, county agent for the State College Extension service.

Through the cooperation of the local Wildlife club and Dudley Smith, Tryon quail breeder, 10 paired birds have been distributed to each of the following: Fred Earl Foster and Joe Harrison, Tryon, Route 1; Gerald Edwards, At Fred Stott, and Bryson Martin Landrum, Route 1; and Jimmie Thompson, Mill Spring, Route 1.

These boys, the county agent explained, were given preference in placements because each has land available where food is plentiful. Each boy also agreed to limit first season hunting so that the birds will have an opportunity to mate and increase their numbers.

Last year 100 birds were placed with 4-H club members, all of whom reported success in increasing the number of quail on their farms.
