SAVE THE SOIL

Mr. Lawrence Garner, supervisor of the Lower Neuse Soil Conservation district, recently remarked how good a job of seeding the highway shoulders the State Highway department has done on Route 101 east of Cherry Point and on the Mill Creek road between Newport and the Prison camp. Mr. Garner further stated "I hope that the Highway department will do the same to the Nine Foot road when it is completed." He also cautioned farmers to use sleds when hauling tillage implements over sodded road shoulders.

Mrs. Daisy Koonce has already grazed a cow and heifer for a week on crimson clover, rye grass winter pasture. She also has mixed rye and oats about ready for grazing; along with two acres of permanent pasture and one acre of sweet clover for next spring and summer.

Kerney Merrill, Sr. and Kerney Merrill, Jr. have both had drainage ditches cut with a dragline during the past week. Kerney, Sr. is the first Carteret county farmer cooperating with the Lower Neuse Soil Conservation district to complete his soil conservation farm plan. Mr. Merrill's plan called for improved open ditch drainage, a permanent pasture, and winter cover crops with crop residue management on all the cropland.
